Tips

- The text on your slides should only be bullet points that you talk about in your presentation.
- Have separate notes for what you are going to say about each bullet point. Don't just read off your slides.
- Make sure your slides are easy to read and use pictures.

Introduction

- Hook your audience, with the broad subject. Explain the main topics of your project.
- Give your audience relevant background info to set up your project and hypotheses

Introduction

State your hypothesis/hypotheses. Remember a hypothesis is a testable statement and be sure to include reason(s) why you think this.

- What did you do?
- You should not include every detail here, but enough to give your audience an idea of what your group did.

Results

- Slide(s) should be mainly graphs
 - One graph per slide
 - Occasionally you can use data tables as well
- Graphs should be easy to read with x and y axes labeled
 - When you talk, walk the audience through your graph
 - Think about what type of graph best displays your results
- You are only presenting the results, explanations go in the discussion

- What other questions or research could you do building off of what you found in your project.
